SERMON NOTES

The Parable of the Vineyard: What Will You Do with the Son? | Matthew 21:33-44

This is one of the most interesting parables ever told by Christ. It is both historical and predictive.

Context is Key: In chapter 21 the fig tree showed that leaves/religion without fruit mean nothing. The parable of the two sons showed that lip-service without obedience is worthless.

- 1. The Itself [vss. 33-39] This is Israel's history as God sees it.
 - He entrusts His vineyard, He gives people freedom, fruit was expected, and the day of accountability came.
 - But they mistreated His servants and even killed some of them. [Mat. 23:37]
 - And instead of receiving and honoring the Son, they cast Him outside the vineyard and killed him.
