Hall of Flaw: Moses | Hebrews 11:24-29

1. The Supplanter [Gen 25; 27]

- To supplant means to _____ another, especially by force or treachery.
- In Gen. 25 Jacob convinces Esau to sell him his _____ for some lentil soup.
- In Gen. 27 with the help of his mother, Jacob steals his father's blessing.

Jacob the supplanter schemed to get what God had already said was his. That is hardly hall of fame activity.

Are you still grasping for something God already promised to give you?

2. The Reckoning [Gen 28-32]

- At Bethel God spoke to Jacob in that vision and promised to go with him wherever he went and to _____ him.
- For the next 20 years the deceiver seems to get a taste of his own _____.
- In Gen. 31 God tells him it is time to return to Canaan.
- Anticipating a difficult reunion Jacob sends _____ ahead to inform his brother that he is coming. The messengers returned with an ominous message: Esau and _____ men are coming to meet Jacob.

3. The Prevailing [Gen 32:22-30]

- He had to confront his past in order to _____ it.
- By seeking God's blessing and finally being weakened and forced to yield, he had become a God empowered prince.

You don't win by getting stronger. You win by refusing to let go.

So What?

- If it's God's will for your life, you will not have to lie, cheat, scheme and steal to get it.
- Sometimes like Jacob we struggle, wrestle, manage, control and hedge instead of simply trusting God with the outcome.
 - When God rules our lives, then He can trust us with His power, only those under His authority have the right to exercise His authority.

THE HALL OF FAME FLAW

Big Idea: God's not looking for perfect people to use. He's looking for imperfect people who'll trust a faithful God.

Hebrew 11:24-29

17 By faith Abraham, when he was tried, offered up Isaac: and he that had received the promises offered up his only begotten son, 18 Of whom it was said, That in Isaac shall thy seed be called:

19 Accounting that God was able to raise him up, even from the dead; from whence also he received him in a figure. 20 By faith Isaac blessed Jacob and Esau concerning things to come. 21 By faith Jacob, when he was a dying, blessed both the sons of Joseph; and worshipped, leaning upon the top of his staff.
